




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
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


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
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


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Psalms 7:17

WHAT IS THE MOST REWARDING THING FROM SHOWING LIVESTOCK?

The most rewarding thing about showing livestock is the relationships that you build along the way. So many people are connected to your successes and failures. There are breeders that you get to know in this industry that extend far beyond a business transaction. IF YOU COULD TELL ONE NEW SHOWMAN SOME WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT WHAT WOULD YOU SAY?

Simply put, dreams do come true, so dream big. I know that we all have these dreams in life, and some of them are so big we never really think they will come true. I hear people all the time talking about how they would spend their hundreds of millions of dollars when they win the lottery, knowing there is a one in three hundred million chance of doing so, but they play anyway and keep dreaming of how they will spend the money. My dream was winning the hardest pig show on Earth, and one in three hundred million was probably a fraction of the odds of winning the San Antonio Livestock Show and Rodeo Market Barrow Show. I can assure you that my dream started at an early age, and I played that moment out in my head millions of times over nine years. I watched year after year some of the best showmen in the business enter the ring at San Antonio and face the same disappointment that I would face. I would go to pig sales and watch these animals sell for unbelievable amounts of money that we would have had to win that lottery to afford. I struggled through animals getting sick on the way to San Antonio and even had an animal class out one year, but with each setback and each time I got knocked to my knees, it was that dream of that moment that got me back up. I dusted myself off and kept working toward my dream of being the final one with my pig in that ring at San Antonio. In 2023, that dream came true, and the funny thing is that looking back on all those dreams didn't prepare me for how that moment would actually be, but they got me there.

WHAT VALUES ARE MOST IMPORTANT TO YOU?

Faith, Family, and Loyalty are the three values that shape who I am and who I'm going to be. If you haven't figured out in this world that we are a small part of something much bigger than us, I'd encourage you to do so. My savior, Jesus Christ, has blessed me in so many ways that there is probably not enough room in this article to write. It is that faith and relationship that fills you and makes you whole, no matter the low or even when you are standing on top of that mountain that you dreamed of for years. Your family will be in your corner always be in your corner and love you on the toughest of days. We don't have a large family, but we unconditionally love each other. IF YOUR FRIENDS COULD DESCRIBE YOU, HOW WOULD THEY?



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
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
Joel and Tim's relationship spans much further back than just the recent launch of Primo Feeds. 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


WHAT IS THE MOST CHALLENGING THING ABOUT SHOWING LIVESTOCK?

Some values that are most important to me would have to be honesty, being respectful to everybody, and always having good sportsmanship no matter the outcome.








HOW DO YOU GO ABOUT SETTING GOALS IN ORDER TO BECOME MORE SUGGESSFUL?

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- 1 tsp. hot sauce
- 1 c. shredded Monterey Jack cheese 2 (15.25 oz.) cans whole kernel corn, well drained
 - 2 (15.25 oz.) cans whole kernel Mexicorn or Fiesta Corn with red & green peppers, drained
 - 1/2 T. to 1 T. chopped pickled jalapeno {about 4 to 6 slices}

Directions

- 1. Toss shredded cheeses, flour, and pepper together in a small bowl. Set aside.
- 2. Combine milk, cream cheese, 1/3 cup green onions, hot sauce, and chopped jalapenos in a 9x13-inch baking dish. Add corn and shredded cheese mixture; stir until well combined.
- 3. Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.
- 4. Uncover, sprinkle with remaining 1/3 cup green onions, and bake 5 minutes more. Sprinkle with chopped cilantro, if desired, just before serving.

Cranberry Orange Cider

- 2 cups cranberry-apple juice
- 1 cup orange juice
- 1 cinnamon stick
- 2 orange slices
- 1 Tablespoon honey

Directions

- 1. Add the cranberry-apple juice, orange juice, cinnamon stick, and orange slices to a medium saucepan over medium high heat.
- 2. Bring to a boil then cover, reduce heat, and simmer for 5 minutes.
- 3. Remove the cinnamon stick and orange slices and stir in the honey.
- 4. Serve warm and garnish with more orange slices & cinnamon sticks if you want.



Grinch Fluff

- 1 8 oz package cream cheese softened
- 3.4 oz vanilla pudding packet
- 1 ½ cup cold milk
- ½ cup powdered sugar
- Green food coloring
- 1 container cool whip
- 3 cups mini marshmallows
 - Red and green sprinkles
 - Whipped cream and maraschino cherries for garnish



- 1. In a large mixing bowl, whisk the cold milk into the vanilla pudding until no lumps remain. Mix in a few drops of green food coloring.
- 2. In a separate mixing bowl, beat the cream cheese and powdered sugar until smooth.
- 3. Mix the whisked vanilla pudding mixture into the cream cheese until well combined.
- 4. Add in the mini marshmallows until coated. Cover the dish with plastic wrap and chill in the refrigerator for at least 1 hour before serving. When ready to serve, top with whipped cream, sprinkles and a maraschino cherry for garnish. Enjoy!

Since I go to a small school, most people are involved in everything. The most challenging thing about showing livestock is finding the time to balance all of the activities I participate in and the barn work/stock shows.




WHAT VALUES ARE MOST IMPORTANT TO YOU?

Theres actually no telling what my friends would say about me, but I think they would for sure say I am a goofy and outgoing person.






WHERE DO YOU SEE YOURSELF IN THE NEXT 5-YEARS?

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

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AND 2 OPINIONS FROM THE SHOW RING FEATURING JOSH BROCKMAN & DAN REED

John 11:25-26: Jesus said to her "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?

What a statement! This is one of many times in Scripture when I just stop and think, that is profound and serious. The way Jesus ends that, "Do you believe this?" was directed to Martha here, but the same question applies to each of us. In context here, Jesus has just arrived on the scene where His beloved friend Lazarus had been dead for 4 days. Jesus is speaking with Martha about this, just before He raises Lazarus from the dead. As Martha believed that Lazarus would be raised up on the last day (v. 24), this particular opportunity of sickness, death, and resurrection was also here in the physical and flesh so God would be glorified by it (v. 4). Today, we have this same question asked of us. Do you believe Jesus walked a perfectly sinless life? That He went to the cross and was crucified to death? Then after 3 days was raised to life and walked the earth again? In 1 Corinthians 15:12-14, Paul writes "Now if Christ is preached that He has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? But if there is no resurrection of the dead, not even Christ has been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is vain, your faith also is vain." The Bible teaches that Jesus, who knew no sin, was made to be sin on our behalf so that we may become the righteousness of God (2 Corinthians 5:21).

The Bible says that Jesus died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve, then to more than 500 at one time, then to James, and all the apostles, then to Paul. (1 Corinthians 15:3-8) Quite the statement and proof of the power of God, and His love for His creation that rebelled against Him in sin. That He would come down in flesh, and conquer that sin that we could not, and pay the penalty of sin, that in Him, we may become children of God through faith in Jesus. (John 1:12) When a believer is baptized, this represents our death, burial, and resurrection in Christ Jesus. We go down into the water, we die to our old self, we are washed in the blood of Jesus, cleansed, and then raised up a new man in Christ Jesus. We are as John 3 says, born again of the Spirit. (John 3:3) The old man has passed away and becomes a new creation in Jesus. In 1 Peter 3 verses 21-22 the Scripture reads, "Corresponding to that, baptism now saves you not the removal of dirt from flesh, but an appeal to God for a good conscience - through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who is at the right hand of God, having gone into heaven, after angels and authorities and powers had been subjected to Him." Peter here is speaking of a union with Christ, as an ark of safety from judgment that the believer takes refuge in. This question Jesus set before Martha is also before you today... "do you believe this?" Do you believe that Jesus did this, that He died for your sin, conquered death for you, and was raised to life just as God said? Are you following Him? Have you surrendered to Him, that you too, because of Jesus, may never die, because you will be resurrected to an imperishable life? Martha's response to Jesus was the response of a believer in Jesus. She said "Yes Lord; I have believed that You are the Christ, the Son of God, He who comes into the world." (John 11:27) What is yours?

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
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

Peanut butter ϑ jelly for sure. I can do a lot of things in a barn or outside, but I am not known to cook much....this meal never fails me.
















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
