NLEE HOGG Hi! My name is Brynlee Hogg, and I am from Lubbock, Texas. Showing livestock is something that my family has been involved in for generations. My grandparents, cousins, aunts and uncles and my parents all showed steers. My brother Becton and I decided to put a twist on It and show sheep and goats. My career started at the age of twelve and from there my love for livestock and the practice of showing grew tremendously. I am currently at a small private school in my hometown that I've gone to since kindergarten.

WHAT IS THE MOST REWARDING Thing from showing livestock

One of the most rewarding parts of showing livestock is the friendships and memories you make along the way. The banners and buckles will fade, but the experiences and connections will last a lifetime. I've found some of my closest, lifelong friends through this industry, and I wouldn't trade that for anything. There's so much more to showing than just money and awards—this industry teaches responsibility, humility, and the importance of kindness. Most importantly, I've gained a second family—my show family—who have supported me every step of the way. Without them, I wouldn't be the person I am today.

WHAT IS THE MOST CHALLENGING Thing about showing livestock?

livestock is letting the animal go. You spend so much time with them—pouring in endless hours of work, dedication, and care—only to have to say goodbye. Whether you like it or not, that moment always comes. It's not just your blood, sweat, and tears in the process; you animal is right there experiencing it all with you. As someone who loves animals and gets attached, letting them go is never easy. But at the end of the day, they serve a purpose, and knowing that helps

be that it's okay to make mistakes. You're still learning and growing, so don't give up when things feel overwhelming. Your success in the ring doesn't define you, but that doesn't mean you shouldn't work hard behind the scenes. There will always be someone else working just as hard, so stay committed and never let up. Most importantly, always remain kind and humble. Never turn down the chance to lend a hand to someone in need, because at the end of the day, the way you treat others is what truly matters.



The values that matter most to me are kindness, humility, and perseverance. You can win every banner and buckle, but if you're remembered for poor sportsmanship and unkindness, those titles lose their significance. Success is temporary, but the way you treat others leaves a lasting impact. You never know what someone else is going through, so choosing kindness—no matter the situation—always matters. I have the utmost respect for those who handle both victories and defeats with grace. In the stock show world, things won't always go as planned. There

will be setbacks, disappointments, and moments of frustration. That's where perseverance comes in. True character is revealed not just in how you handle success, but in how you push through challenges. Staying kind and humble, even in the hardest moments, is rare—but it's a mindset worth striving for, both in the show ring and in life.











WHEN YOU GRADUATE WHAT DO YOU WANT TO BE REMEMBERED FOR IN THE STOCK SHOW WORLD?

In the stock show world, I want to be remembered as In the stock show world, I want to be remembered as someone who was kind, humble, and hardworking— someone who always had a smile on my face, no matter the circumstances. My faith in Christ reminds me that success isn't just measured in banners and buckles, but in the way we treat others. I strive to reflect His love by staying positive, encouraging others, and showing kindness to everyone, whether they're in the winner's circle or just getting started. Hard work is important, but so is having a heart for others and a joyful spirit. At the end of the day, I want people to remember me not just for what I accomplished in the ring, but for the impact I left on those around me.

TAKE, AND WHAT WOULD YOU TELL THEM?

Oh, taking Adam Sandler to lunch would be legendary. He seems like the kind of guy who'd have a blast at a county fair or a stock show, cracking jokes the whole time but also genuinely appreciating the hard work behind it all. I'd tell him about the depth to what FFA and 4-H offers the youth involved and the difference made ripples across communities throughout America. When some think of FFA and 4-H they stereotype thinking it's just about farming or livestock, but both 4-H and FFA teach leadership, responsibility, and perseverance through a variety of programs. I'd probably throw in a funny story about embarrassing myself in the show ring (because you know that would happen), and I feel like he'd get a kick out of the chaos that comes with working livestock. And if I could convince him to come to a show? Imagine Adam Sandler in the stands, hyping up kids in the show ring-now that would be unforgettable.

IF YOUR FRIENDS COULD DESCRIBE YOU, HOW WOULD THEY?

I would say my friends would describe me as bubbly, ditzy, and kind. While I may embarrass myself from time to time, I always manage to make someone laugh. Sometimes, I can be a little slow in processing things, which leads to some funny mistakes, but I like to think I keep things interesting. Lalways make sure that things interesting. I always make sure that everyone has what they need to succeed, and I do my best to get things done—just in my own "special" way.



WHERE DO YOU SEE Yourself in the next

In the next five years, I see myself graduating with my undergrad and hopefully on my way to vet school. So much could change during that time, but I have faith that God has a plan for me, no matter what the next five years hold.

WHAT MOTIVATES YOU TO BE A GOOD LEADER, AND TO PUT FORTH (OUR BEST EFFORT?

What motivates me to be a good leader is knowing that there's a younger generation looking up to me. I remember being in their shoes, thinking that the seniors were the coolest people around. Now, I strive to show them what true leadership looks like, which is rooted in humility and putting in the hard work necessary. I want those kids to always believe in themselves and never want to give up, which means I can't give up either. It's okay to fail and make mistakes, but the important thing is to get back up and keep pushing forward. (nowing that I am a role model for the younger generation pushes me to give my best in everything I do, while staying humble and true to myself







WHO IS YOUR**HULE**

My role model is my Pepa. If I had to describe him in one word, it would be humble. In every situation, he consistently chooses others over himself. I'll never forget the early mornings at softball when he showed up with a box of doughnuts for the whole team. No matter the circumstances, whether people deserved it or not, he always showed kindness and compassion. He truly radiates the light of Jesus, and that's something I strive to embody every day.



HOW DO YOU GO ABOUT Setting goals in order to Become more successful?

Setting goals for myself comes from understanding the importance of the work behind the scenes. Results don't just happen—they demand consistent practice and effort. Without putting in the extra work, success becomes much harder to achieve. Knowing that there are others out there working just as hard, striving for the same level of success, motivates me to give my best effort. In the end, you have to be good enough to be lucky enough to win.





Success can be defined in many ways, and everyone sees it differently. For some, it's measured by banners and buckles, and while those are achievements to be proud of, they aren't what truly define success. Real success is found in the little things—the early mornings, the late nights, and the countless hours of hard work behind the scenes. The grit and dedication put in at the barn are just as meaningful as any award.

In the face of challenges, perseverance is the key to success. Whether things go your way or not, the ability to get back up, push through, and keep striving forward is a victory in itself.



LEGACY LEAVERS. WRITTEN BY DEVIN SISK



Deep in the forests of northern California, massive redwood trees tower above the earth with quiet strength. But what's most remarkable about them isn't their height-it's what happens underground. Despite their impressive size, redwoods do not have deep roots. Instead, they grow outward, reaching and intertwining with each other and holding strong together. Alone, they most definitely would fall. But together, they stand.

In so many ways, the stock show world is just like that.

We all know that the path of a showman is rarely an easy journey. Despite the many hardships that exhibitors face, it's also filled with growth, resilience, and relationships that tether us to something bigger than ourselves. The most memorable legacies aren't built on buckles or banners-but on the ways we intertwine our lives with others. Perhaps, it is the way we carry ourselves, the way we work through adversity, and maybe, just the way we show up for one another.

This year, three standout showmen-Brynlee Hogg, Madden Wise, and Aniston Floyd-have embodied that deeper meaning. Their names might be known for the titles they've earned, because WOW! Their show careers have been some of the most successful of this

era. But their true legacy is in how they've walked this journey: with humility, perspective, and unwavering faith.

As Brynlee reflects on her final year in the ring, her focus isn't on the banners she hung, but on the character she hopes she built along the way. "When I think about what I want to be remembered for, being humble comes to my mind, I hope to be remembered as someone who took every win or loss gracefully." she shares. "Someone who was never too good to lend someone a hand... someone who let Christ shine through me."

Her road was marked with the kind of hard work that doesn't always make headlines-long nights, early mornings, and moments of doubt. But it was also full of mentorship and meaningful relationships. One of the most impactful came during her last national show in Denver, when her mentor, "Sister," gave her words that still echo in her heart: "Bryn, no matter how today goes, take everything in... This is such a great moment in your life, but the next season is so much better. You'll love the other side of the ring."

That reminder to soak it all in-to look around and really see the people, the animals, and the moments carried her through the rest of her final season. And now, she wants to pass it on: "Enjoy every

At the root of all of it was Madden's faith. "It's all been through faith and

much it meant to him. That moment wasn't about winning in the traditional sense—it was about carrying something forward for the people who got me here." For Madden, legacy meant honoring those who came before, while living out values that would inspire future showmen.

While Brynlee and Madden are closing the chapter on their show careers, Aniston Floyd still has one year left in the ring—but she's already steadied by the things that matter most. Her journey hasn't been without hardship or heartbreak. She knows what it feels like to work hard and walk away without a win. "I remember asking God why the show didn't go the way I wanted it to," she recalls. "But then I remembered—you learn just as much from the losses as you do the wins."

Her sister's advice became a touchstone: "No matter what happens today, it's in God's hands. And when has He ever given you a reason to doubt Him?" The perspective that Ashton presented to Aniston gave her the ability to live presently in each moment and to trust that her worth was never measured by a judge's decision. Isn't that something we all should remember?

The lessons Aniston is most proud of can't be measured in buckles. "I've learned that just because you aren't blood doesn't mean you aren't family," she says. "Banner or not, the same people will always be there." Legacy literally means leaving something behind that is lasting. It's not about being remembered for your winnings- It's about how you made people feel and whether or not your light pointed others to something greater than just what is inside the show barn. I think it is important that we ask ourselves, "Who are you linking arms with along the way?"

Like the redwoods, these three showmen have found strength not in standing alone—but by intertwining their roots with mentors, family, friends, and faith. And now, they've become that strength for the next generation of showmen to lean on.

That's a legacy that will stand tall—long after the barns become empty and quiet and lights in the show ring fade.

Brisket Tacos

- Ingredients
 - 2 Tbsp. olive oil
 - 1 (4 lb.) piece brisket flat, trimmed
 - 4 tsp. kosher saltd
 - 2 1/2 tsp. black pepper
 - 1 white onion, thinly sliced
 - 6 garlic cloves, chopped

Directions

1.For the brisket: Heat the oil in a large Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Sprinkle the brisket all over with 3 teaspoons of the salt and 2 teaspoons of the pepper. Cook the brisket, turning occasionally, until browned on all sides, 10 to 12 minutes. Transfer the brisket to a large plate; set aside.

2. Return the Dutch oven with the drippings to medium heat. Add the onion, garlic, and ginger. Cook, stirring occasionally, until softened, about 6 minutes. Stir in 2 cups of water, chipotles in

> adobo, vinegar, oregano, cumin, the remaining 1 teaspoon salt, and remaining ¹/₂ teaspoon pepper. Nestle the meat in the pan.

3.Bring the broth to a simmer over medium-heat. Cover and decrease the heat to low to maintain a low simmer. Cook until the brisket is fork tender, 4 to 5 hours.

4. Using two forks, shred the brisket in the Dutch oven. Cover and keep warm over low.



Directions

1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F and grease a 3 qt baking dish (9x13"). Set aside. 2. Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. When boiling, add dried pasta and cook 1 minute less than the package directs for al dente. Drain and drizzle with a little bit of olive oil to keep from sticking. 3. While water is coming up to a boil, shred cheeses and toss together to mix, then divide into three piles. Approximately 3 cups for the sauce, $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups for the inner layer, and $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups for the topping. 4. Melt butter in a large saucepan over MED heat. Sprinkle in flour and whisk to combine. Mixture will look like very wet sand. Cook for approximately 1 minute, whisking often. Slowly pour in about 2 cups or so of the half and half, while whisking constantly, until smooth. Slowly pour in the remaining half and half plus the whole milk, while whisking constantly, until combined and smooth.

5. Continue to heat over MED heat, whisking very often, until thickened to a very thick consistency. It should almost be the consistency of a semi thinned out condensed soup. 6. Remove from the heat and stir in spices and $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups of the cheeses, stirring to melt and combine Stir in another 1 1/2 cups of cheese, and stir until completely melted and smooth.





Beat in dry ingredients until just combined. Cover bowl with plastic and refrigerate until firm, at least 2 hours and up to overnight.

3. Preheat oven to 325° and line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Roll dough into 2" balls, then roll in powdered sugar. Let sit 2 minutes until sugar is absorbed, then reroll in powdered sugar (do not shake off excess). Place about 2" apart on prepared baking sheet and bake until cookies crackle and are set but still slightly soft in the center, 18 to 20 minutes. Transfer to a cooling rack and let cool completely.

Along the way, we have been fortunate to hang some banners at quite a few of these shows.
